This is an ONLINE version of Modern World History. Please keep in mind that the online format will require students to complete work and stay up to date on assignments on their own without as much oversight from the course instructor. There will not be any need to come to campus. All the tests, quizzes, and assignments will be on the class page and students will submit essays through their SFCS email account.

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### Math Camp - Problem Solving with Combinatorics

**This math camp has two instructors:** Mike Maxon (SFCS Math Team coach and national award winner for excellence in the teaching of math problem solving) and Paolo Pasco (SFCS graduate who was ranked in the top 314 in the nation in math problem solving). This allows us to appropriately challenge every student each day as well as provide more individualized feedback to help students become better math problem solvers.

The math camp will focus on Combinatorics and Probability (one of the most fun topics in all of mathematics). This is a problem solving class in which students will be learning mathematics through solving interesting problems, many of which have shown up on national mathematics competitions and college readiness exams. The class will help students solve the types of problems that they would see on the SAT, SAT level 2 math exam and the American Mathematics Competition (AMC).

The American Mathematics Competition (AMC) is the largest mathematics competition in the world. The AMC test is similar to the SAT math subject matter test but doing well on the AMC requires a much deeper knowledge of the math concepts, ability to visualize, reason and problem solve. After preparing for the AMC test the SAT math and SAT level 2 math subject matter tests should begin to feel easy. The AMC is a 25 problem test that students have 75 minutes to complete and is offered by Santa Fe Christian School each February to any students who wishes to compete. Many of the top universities now use a student's AMC score in determining admissions.

**Prerequisite:** Completed Algebra 1 and earned at least a B+ in your previous math class.

**Note:** Students who register after May 23 will have to purchase their own \$42 textbooks online at the Art of Problem Solving Website.

### Pre-Algebra/Algebra Building a Strong Foundation in Math

The Pre-algebra/Algebra course exposes students to a wide variety of basic algebra topics taught from a problem-solving perspective. Students will explore integers and fractions and prove their answers through drawings. Fractional drawings will be based on the use of pattern blocks. Students will make tables and graphs from experiments and word problems. By studying these graphs, students will examine the rate of change over time. The class focuses on understanding concepts versus rule memorization. All mathematical concepts are taught with an emphasis on real-world application through a Biblical worldview. \*This course is highly recommended for incoming 6th grade students who are advancing to pre-algebra in the fall.
