## Frequently Asked Questions

1. **Is the scholarship for one year or multiple years?** Our expectation is that the scholarship will follow the recipients through graduation at SFC. Recipients are eligible to have the scholarship renewed annually based on grades, conduct, involvement in SFC and continuing financial need.
2. **What is the application process?** The completed application, including the separately emailed reference letter, must be submitted to the front office at SFC and/or emailed to [Hoekstra@sfcs.net](mailto:Hoekstra@sfcs.net) by 4pm on Friday January 18, 2019.
3. **Can I lose my William Wardrip Foundation Scholarship?** Yes, a scholarship may be canceled at any time because of conduct the Wardrip Foundation Board deems contrary to the acceptable academic, citizenship, and spiritual standards set by the Foundation and at SFC.
4. **Will my picture/story be published?** Yes, SFC and the William Wardrip Foundation will use the recipients' images and any related information in publications, press releases, social media, and on their respective websites.
5. **How many scholarships are awarded annually?** It varies depending on the number of qualified/deserving applicants and how much money the William Wardrip Foundation raises each year. The Foundation is a 501(c)(3) non-profit and thus raises money from donors and budgets scholarships accordingly.
6. **What is the timeline?**
  - a. Deadline for all completed applications is Friday, January 18, 2019
  - b. Scholarships awarded by Thursday, January 31, 2019.
  - c. Re-enrollment deadline is Friday, February 8, 2019.
